

More Retirees Eligible for Reduced-Fee Vehicle Registration

A new state law I supported to allow more Pennsylvania retirees to qualify for a reduction in their vehicle registration fee takes effect this Sunday.

The benefit now will be available to retired persons earning up to \$29,906, an increase of more than \$10,000 from the prior income eligibility limit. Those who qualify will pay an \$11 processing fee to register their vehicle each year, rather than the standard \$45 registration fee.

Qualified applicants must be retired and receiving Social Security or other pension payments. Please note, 100% of a veterans' benefit payment or payment to the unmarried surviving spouse, upon the death of a veteran, should be excluded from the income calculation.

The applicant must be listed as an owner on the vehicle's registration and only one vehicle per qualified applicant may be registered for the reduced fee. Qualifying vehicles must be a passenger car or truck with a registered gross weight of not more than 9,000 pounds.

New Military-Themed License Plates Honor PA Veterans

Six new license plates honoring the service of the Commonwealth's veterans are now available from the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation. The new plates were authorized under Act 60 of 2024.

Three of the new plates recognize service members who received medals or honors for individual achievements or deployments. They include the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal Registration Plate, Operation Inherent Resolve Veterans Plate, and Borinqueneers Congressional Gold Medal Registration Plate.

The other three new plate designs recognize women veterans. Two are available for motorcycles and the third is for passenger cars or trucks with a registered gross weight of not more than 14,000 pounds. They include the Honoring Our Women Veteran Motorcycle Registration Plate, Women Veteran Motorcycle Registration Plate and the Women Veteran Registration Plate.





The CTA, BOI and FinCEN: Takeaways for Mechanicsburg, PA SBOs

The Corporate Transparency Act may require certain U.S. companies to disclose beneficial ownership information to FinCEN to combat financial crimes.

While a Texas federal district court's preliminary injunction puts this requirement on hold, many experts expect that to be overturned. In that event, failure to file could lead to fines of \$500 per day,

up to a maximum of \$10,000, and possible criminal penalties.

However, filing your Beneficial Ownership Information (BOI) report will help you avoid fines if this injunction is overruled. Waiting could mean scrambling to meet compliance requirements or penalties. ZenBusiness offers help via simple and streamlined BOI compliance tools for SBOs that want to circumvent trouble by breezing through their obligations in advance.

1. Determine if Your Business Must File.

A 'reporting company' is any small business, corporation, or LLC that is registered with the state, unless exempt. Exemptions apply to publicly traded companies, banks, and charities. For example, a local bakery in Mechanicsburg, PA would likely need to file a BOI report.

2. Identify Your Beneficial Owners.

A 'beneficial owner' is someone who has substantial control over a company or owns at least 25% of it. This can include decision-makers, managing partners, or co-owners with significant stakes. For example, in Mechanicsburg, the owner of a shoe repair shop who oversees daily operations and holds a 40% ownership stake is considered a beneficial owner.

3. Gather the Required Information.

Prepare:

Business name, address, and EIN. Beneficial owners' names, addresses, DOBs, and ID details.

4. File Your BOI Report.

Deadlines:

Existing businesses: File by 01/01/2025.

New companies (2024): File within 90 days of formation. New companies (2025+): File within 30 days of formation.
